Australian Rotary Health Research Fund

ARHRF has committed its major research efforts in the coming years to mental health issues.

Mental Illness is experienced by 1 in 5 Australians and as such, impacts on all Australian families.

Our District clubs have always supported the fund well and the sale of Christmas cards has been a significant contribution over many years now.

Last year in Australia, \$50 000 was contributed to the fund through card sales – in total, \$353 000 over ten years.

Clubs are being asked to sell at least ten packs (at \$12 ea incl GST) each this year.

Polio is a more elusive enemy than smallpox.

Some 200 people can be infected before a case of paralysis finally signals an outbreak. As long as it exists anywhere, polio threatens children's lives.

Some clubs provide a pack of cards as a gift in appreciation of a guest speaker. In others, members buy them for family use.

District ARHRF Chair Martin Zaugg is keen to assist clubs with the planning for Community based

awareness raising Mental Health Forums.

Child Protection

Both New South Wales and Queensland have recently introduced child (<18) protection legislation.

Rotary clubs are required to ensure that their practices are in line with the legislation.

One of the major requirements is that all personnel who have an ongoing association with young people (in churches, clubs, schools, etc) are suitable for this.

In NSW, they simply sign a form that is retained by the club. In Queensland, such people must apply for a suitability card that remains current for two years.
